DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE OBJECT

The doll is in a seated, semi-reclining position, leaning on one hand. She is dressed in a traditional kimono in dark grey silk with light grey patterns in some areas. It has hanging sleeves and is double-lined in pale grey and pale pink. She has a formal hairstyle with several ornaments of shell (?) and metal. Her hair and eyelashes appear to have been individually inserted in the head.

She is in a glass case which measures 24 inches x 22 ½ inches x 17 ½ inches. The doll is seated on a short (approx.. 1 inch high) wooden platform. Behind her there is a panel the size of the back of the case covered with printed fabric.
