DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE OBJECT

The Revere 22 stereo slide viewer is a focusing, internally lit slide viewer (can be switched to AC power with a Revere Transformer or similar accessory). The Viewer has

a pair of double element glass lenses for distortion free viewing. The body is brown Bakelite. It is its original box which is 7 inches wide x 8 ¼ inches high x 2 ¾ inches deep.

Needs 2 D-cell batteries to operate; there is an extra bulb in the box.

Also in the box is a Kodak box of 7 stereo slides. These appear to be family pictures. For many years Kodak would mount slides from stereo cameras, whether the cameras were Kodak or not.
