**DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE OBJECT:**

Spotted fawn, felted wool on metal frame, standing with head turned.  
Painted felt in fawn colors, felted eyes painted black, black hoofs.

18" head to tail, 18" high, 12" wide (front view), on a rough cut log slice approximately 18" diameter x 3 ½" high.
