Shown are people at Camp and scenes of Camp life, the pet chipmunk, views from Black Mountain and Buck Mountain, speedboats, steamboats, Hague and the Hague Regatta, and Fort Ticonderoga.

SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE RECORDS

Lake George Camp for Boys Photograph Collection consists primarily of a photograph album, 1922-1924, prepared by George Phelps. The album contains approximately 200 black and white prints, mostly 2 ½ X 3 ½ in size. Shown are people at Camp and scenes of Camp life, the pet chipmunk, views from Black Mountain and Buck Mountain, speedboats, steamboats, Hague and the Hague Regatta, 1922 and 1923, Fort Ticonderoga, and tornado damage in Lorain, Ohio. Also included are four publications of the Camp: descriptive catalogs for 1924, 1926, and 1928; also the reunion number of *The Point o' View* (newsletter of the Camp), December 27, 1924. The Camp was located Point O' View on Lake George, Glen Eyrie, N.Y.
